Summary of key findings for parents

The provision is good

- Children are confident and happy in the club. They settle well in the routines, enjoy outside play and like the creative activities that have been put out by the staff, which compliments their ongoing learning
- Children play in a clean, welcoming environment, where all areas have been fully risk assessed to maintain children's safety. Children show that they feel safe as they play and explore in all areas available within the club with confidence.
- Behaviour is good, children are well-mannered, kind and considerate to each other and helpful. Staff support the children's self-esteem well with a good amount of praise and encouragement.
- Staff have effective partnerships with parents and keep them well informed about their children's time at the club. For example, staff talk to parents daily and provide regular newsletters.
- The management team follow effective systems for safer recruitment, which ensures staff working with children are safe and suitable.

It is not yet outstanding because:

- The management team do not sharply focus enough time on all staff's professional development to help raise the quality of the provision to the highest level.
- Children are unable to freely access additional toys and resources as required during their play.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

- strengthen the evaluation of staff practice more sharply to identify further training opportunities and help raise the quality of provision to an even higher level
- review the accessibility of equipment for all activities to allow children to make individual decisions and independent choices.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed activities available to children.
- The inspector observed interactions between children and staff.
- The inspector to parents available about their views and opinions of the provision and considered these.
- The inspector asked staff questions about their work and observed practice with the manager.
- The inspector sampled documentation including policies and procedures, staff recruitment and supervision records.

Inspection findings

Effectiveness of leadership and management is good

Safeguarding is effective. Staff have a good understanding of the signs and symptoms that may indicate that a child is at risk. The management team provide staff with detailed safeguarding procedures and referral information on their identification badges, which help them to know who to contact in the event of a concern. The management team provide staff with suitable training to ensure that they are aware of their roles and responsibilities for the club. For example, staff have had food hygiene training, which has helped them to ensure that children's health is maintained through effective hygiene practises. Staff have good partnerships with teachers and other professionals within schools. For instance, staff regularly seek and share achievements and messages about children, to support continuity in children's care. The management team have suitable self-evaluation processes in place, which they use to review the club activities.

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good

Staff provide a welcoming environment for the children, which allows the children to be active or rest as needed, after a day at school. Staff set up the room prior to children's arrival, to ensure children have access to a range of activities which provide interest. For example, children enjoy playing card games, colouring in pictures linking to 'anti bullying week' and exploring with dough. Staff are skilled at engaging with the children and support their listening and speaking skills well. For instance, they ask children questions about their play and include them well in conversations. Staff track and observe early years children progress well. For example, they observe, track and check the children's learning and development to ensure they all make ongoing progress.

Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

Staff offer good support to the children and promote their independence and social skills well. For example, children chat socially to their friends at snack times and staff help them to make cheese toasties as required. Children benefit highly from freshly prepared and well balanced and nutritious foods. Staff support children's ideas well. For example, the 'Ark council' asked for the snack to be changed into a self-serving area which is being trailed successfully. Children understand the importance of following good hygiene routines. For example, they wash their hands before eating. Staff support the children's physical skills well. For instance, children enjoy learning to sew and being physically active outside as they play table tennis, swing ball and running games.

The Ark After School Club registered in 2004. It operates from St Bede's Church of England Primary School in Winchester. The club operates before school on Mondays to Fridays from 7.45am until 9.30am. After school sessions are on Mondays to Thursdays from 3.20pm until 6pm and until 5pm on Fridays, during school terms. There are 27 members of staff, of whom 14 staff hold relevant qualifications.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register.
